## Sharing the value of accreditation

Within the next three months, Shares, Inc. will participate in its tenth CARF Accreditation survey.

### What exactly is CARF??

Founded in 1966 as the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, CARF International, a group of companies that include CARF Canada and CARF Europe, is an independent, nonprofit accreditor of health and human services.

### So, what is an accreditation survey?

CARF accreditation is a continuous improvement process where peers apply internationally recognized standards to an organization's programs through a consultative survey. Organizations, like Shares. Inc., achieve accreditation by demonstrating conformance to CARF standards. CARF accredits over 60,000 programs and more than 8,000 service providers at approximately 28,000 locations across five continents.

### Why CARF accreditation?

CARF accreditation is a symbol of an organization's commitment to enhancing the quality of its services in support of positive outcomes for the persons served. During the accreditation process, surveyors use a consultative approach to support quality improvement in a program's operations and services, offering perspective and strategies from professional experience. CARF accredited organizations are recognized for their ongoing innovation and continued conformance to the standards. Accredited organizations enjoy many benefits, including greater financial stability, enhanced risk management, the ability to market their accreditation status, and access to an international network of accredited providers.
