#### Shares, Inc. remains steadfast through the pandemic

It has been a very busy time here at Shares, Inc. The past few years have brought a lot of change in how we operate as an agency. Thanks to all of our amazing staff, we have continued to grow and provide exceptional customer service during these uncertain times. Even with the COVID restrictions put in place, our staff never wavered in providing top-notch service and care to our participants and we are immensely proud of this team for all their hard work.

I want to highlight some of our successes over the last two years. Shares, Inc. has recently completed a new website that is updated and mobile friendly and will help showcase the services we provide. After a lot of hard work we have successfully converted to a new operating system, internally, that will allow management and staff to be more efficient in their daily duties. I have recently purchased a third truck to help support our growing document destruction division, Shares Shredding and Recycling.

Over this past year, we have employed and trained over 170 participants. Our staff have helped lead this group in almost doubling our fiscal sales numbers from the previous

year. This has allowed for an increase in overall available work hours and wages paid out to our participants. We have been working diligently to improve our safety culture and making sure that Shares. Inc. is a safe place for all to work. To date we have gone 146 days since a recordable incident. While we continue to strive for improvements, we have made great strides even in a difficult climate!

Unfortunately, we had to cancel the 2022 Shares, Inc. Educational Trip. I know how much this means to everyone and I hope that in 2023 we will be able to get back to providing these experiences and memories that last a lifetime.

Thanks to all who continue to serve our participants and help Shares, Inc. continue to grow. We all have so much to be proud of and we look forward to our continued growth together!



## Living Skills receives grant for program development

Thanks to a generous grant from the Indiana Arts Commission, Shares, Inc. is able to provide ongoing art classes to participants from all three counties this year.

Robin Jeffries has headed up the program, focusing on enrichment and engaging curriculum. Each monthly class involves a brief lesson on a famous artist, past or present, and a hands-on project related to that artist or the artist's technique.

Participants have learned (or will learn) about famous artists such as Claude Monet, Vincent Van Gogh, Pablo Picasso, Edvard Munch, and Gustav Klimt. Robin has also selected education surrounding contemporary artists: Sarah Coey, Hugo Pineda and Dale Chihuly.

Each quarter, Shares, Inc. has selected local artists to teach and share art. Our first artist, Claudean Korff, painted and decorated jars with participants. Future guests will include local artist, Sandy Hall, local screen printer, Charlie Vetters and there will be a special surprise guest.

This is a wonderful educational opportunity, and participants are enjoying being artists and having a masterpiece that they can take home to be proud of. The program will end in June 2022.
